<p>Learn the 'Spring Chicken' song. Available with lyrics at:</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=IEey4LZLeGw or can be played on Alexa.</p>	<p>Look out for butterflies and create a detailed symmetrical picture of the one you liked the most or one you would like to see.</p>	<p>Spring time sees the start of new life. Can you make a list of animals and their offspring, e.g:</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Cow - calf Swan - ?</p> <p>Research these and then test your family's knowledge.</p>
<p>Do a collective drawing of the Easter Bunny. Each person gets to draw section of the picture. e.g. the head, the neck and shoulders, the rest of the body, the legs, the feet.</p> <p>Make it more fun by folding the paper into sections so that the person before or after you can't see what you have drawn, then open it out at the end.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Write a Spring Poem.</p> <p>You might want to try an acrostic or haiku.</p> <p><u>Acrostic</u> - <i>The first letter of each line spells out a word down the side of the page.</i></p> <p>Special time in the sunshine Preparing to grow</p> <p>R I N G</p> <p><u>Haiku</u> - <i>A poem consisting of 3 lines and 17 syllables. Each line has an assigned number of 'beats'.</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;">The sun is shining (5 syllables) Spring is a time for new life (7 syllables) Happy times to come. (5 syllables)</p>	<p>Look out of your window or in your garden at all the new things that are growing in Spring.</p> <p>Can you recreate a flower, plant or tree that you can see?</p> <p>This could be done with junk modelling, still drawing, natural printing or any other creative way you can think of!</p>
<p>Play 'Hot and Cold'. Hide an object or 'treasure' somewhere in the house. The only clues you can give for someone else to find it is 'cold' if they are far away from it or 'hot' if they are near. The more difficult the hiding place, the better!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">House Basketball</p> <p>Use a bucket or a bin and throw a scrunched-up scrap paper ball into this 'goal'. Each time you score, move the basket further away.</p>	<p>Have an 'Egg and Spoon Race' with some of your family members. If you don't have any eggs around, try using a small ball instead. Add to the challenge by creating an obstacle course to complete without dropping your egg!</p>
<p>Draw or sketch an Easter Bunny that could be stuck in your window to cheer up anyone passing by.</p>	<p>Play the 'Alphabet Game'. Think of a theme e.g. animals, then try to find one for each letter of the alphabet.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">A=Ant, B=Bat, C=Cat, D=Dog</p>	<p>Go camping indoors by making an indoor tent. Collect fabrics and blankets and set up your own tent, where you can tell stories and sing songs together.</p>
