# School Improvement Plan for 2022 – 2023/ Pupil Equity Fund Work

We continue to work on our SIP priorities. Here are some of the activities we have worked on:

Mrs McLeod has continued to work on our Literacy development work. She plans to hold a parent workshop on VCOP next term.

Mrs Drennan has attended Nurture UK training

Mrs Drennan is also completing Maths Recovery training. This will mean we have managed to train both Mrs Drennan and Mrs McInnes this session.

Mrs Donnelly has implemented some of the play pedagogy ideas and is working on a practitioner enquiry as part of this work.

All staff are implementing the Healthy Schools approach using the online framework. They all report that they feel this has been a positive move.

Mrs Bond has had lots of work around our move to ICT Cloud Solution and staff have been introduced to aspects of this. SLC plan to switch us to the Cloud Solution on week 1 of the new term. This will mean that only Chromebooks will be in use for a short period during that week.

All pupils have access to Sumdog, both in school and at home.

#### Staff Development/Training

Staff continue to attend training and professional learning opportunities, some of which I've already mentioned. Others include: Attachment Lead and Ambassador Network ICT Coordinator Meeting and Thinglink introduction Maths Recovery and Nurture UK training as mentioned before Curriculum and Quality Improvement Conference and a number of Newly Qualified Teacher events Talk for Writing training Boxall - pupil profiling training Miss MacDonald, our newly qualified teacher, has attended a variety of training opportunities as part of SLC's NQT programme All staff are also engaging with our Learning Community to undertake a practitioner enquiry on a chosen area. We hosted 3 groups here in January.

As always, staff are keen to develop their skills through professional learning opportunities.

#### Proposed Strike Day

We will aim to keep our parents informed of any forthcoming disruptions. Should an agreement not be reached the next dates to impact on Underbank will be 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> March. LGS will be impacted on 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> March.

## Health and Safety Traffic Management Inspection

This took place over two sessions, one on 22nd November and one on 17th January. I have given mention to the inspection in our school Updates.

From these visits, we were asked to remind parents that the drop off area was not for parking in and that we ensure that the bus parking zone remains clear for all of our school transport to access.

I have again asked the police to attend when they are able, to encourage the traffic on the main A72 to slow down. The police have agreed to attend and to monitor the speed of the traffic periodically.

A concern was raised about parents encouraging their children to cross the A72 into Silverbirch when there is ample parking and a school crossing patrol person to safely cross pupils and parents.

On the second visit it was noted that the flashing school signs were not working. These have now been reported.

Please look out for these and let me know when they are operational. They should flash for a short period each morning and again at the end of the school day.
