Possible industrial action on 8th November

As previous advised via email on Friday 27th October and yesterday, 2nd November, industrial action is planned to take place on Wednesday 8th November. Should this go ahead, our Flu Immunisation will be impacted, and we have been given a proposed date of Wednesday 20th December. Should the industrial action be postponed, our flu immunisation will take place on 8th November as previously planned. Teachers will issue all pupils with home learning activities to be tackled if pupils are off school on this day.

i-Pad Fundraising

I am delighted to share with you that we have this week, ordered 25 brand new i-pads with protective covers for use in school.

We initially hoped to purchase 20 i-Pads but we recently found out that our fundraising efforts in Tesco had paid off and we have been awarded £1000 for digital learning from Tesco. So together with our PFA's donation of £4000, other parental donations of over £1000, a contribution by the school of just over £1000 and Tesco's £1000, we are able to buy a full class set. Thank you so much to everyone involved in this fundraising effort – what a fabulous result! We hope our new i-Pads will be in school in the next month or so.

Kindness Initiative at Underbank
