Reminders

Pupils' Body Sprays and Spray Deodorants

Please refrain from allowing pupils to bring body sprays and spray deodorants to school. We have had one child who has had an allergic reaction to a spray and these sprays can impact negatively on pupils with asthma. Our senior pupils have been notified of this.

Thank you for supporting us to ensure that our pupils do not bring these products to school.

Birthday Treats - Health Promoting School

As parents may be aware, we are not allowed to distribute birthday cakes in school due to allergies etc. Following on from this, parents are now sending in large bags of funsize sweets, chocolate bars and packets of Haribo etc. We are a health promoting school and as such, we do not encourage the eating of snacks that do not fall into the 'healthy snack' category in school.

Children's birthdays are always marked and celebrated in class and at our weekly assemblies. Children get to choose a treat from the 'Birthday Box' therefore, I would really appreciate if parents could refrain from sending in treats to be handed out at 3pm. Your help with this is greatly appreciated.

Uniform

We allow pupils to wear their leggings, joggers to school on their PE days. On all other days of the school week they should wear their uniform and **not** leggings/joggers.

Chewing Gum in School

We do not allow chewing gum in school, at any time, and would appreciate if you could ensure that your child does not bring this into the school.

After School Arrangements

Please contact the school office before 2:30pm if your child has not to go on the school bus.

Please also bear in mind when asking other parents to collect your child, that we would really appreciate if we could be notified of these arrangements. This is particularly important for our younger children.

Lost Property - Please label

We endeavour to ensure that pupils return home from school with all of their belongings and can easily do this if items have a child's name on them. If we can't identity who an item belongs to, then we put it into our lost property box in our foyer. Please feel free to pop in and check this box, if your child does misplace any items.

Uniform and Belongings

Children should wear their school uniform and should wear jackets and footwear that are suitable for playing and learning outdoors. Children will change into indoor shoes on entering the building each day. If going outdoors for PE, then our children will wear the outdoor shoes they are wearing to school on their PE days.

Please ensure that all items of clothing, footwear, packed lunches, snack tubs etc. are all clearly labelled with your child's name.
