# **Edina Trust – National Science Experiment**

Room 5 have been granted a place to participate in this project. This project is a long running climate change investigation, involving around primary schools across the UK. They ask our young scientists to record the rainfall and temperature each school day from planting day (late October) until the end of the project (end of March). The weather results need to be inputted online on the National Museum Wales website. Pupils watch their daffodils and crocuses grow and record when they flower, and the height of the plants when the flowers open. The data gathered is used to investigating the effect of the climate on the growth of the spring bulbs across the UK. In May, every school is provided with the results of the national experiment.

As we have children in school who have an allergy to nuts, we request that no snacks, confectionery, etc which contain or may contain nuts, are sent into the school.

# Car Parking

As many of you know, our school car park is congested at the end of the school day, we would like to encourage parents to 'park and stride' to avoid this congestion. Parents are encouraged to either park in the village or directly in front of our old school and then use Mr Hamilton, our school crossing patrol person, to cross the main road. Please do not park on the school side of the main road as this can cause difficulties for other road users.

#### Bus Bays/Drop off zone

The designated bus bays must be kept clear for our school minibuses and taxis at the end of the school day. The same applies to the drop off zone, please do not park here, this is purely for dropping off children before 9am. Our school minibuses and after school care buses sometimes spill into this area.
