JRSO Survey Results

We did a 'Show of Hands' survey for the Scottish Government to see how pupils at Underbank travel to school. Our results are added to the results from other schools across Scotland. Here are our results:

- 61% of our pupils were driven to school on survey day.
- Only 6% of our pupils cycled.
- 26% travelled via school transport.

We are going to try to encourage more 'active' travelling.

Regular checks

A Class Charter is a visual document that establishes an agreed set of rights-based principles linked to the articles of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). By creating Charters, we aim to promote positive learning environments and positive relationships within our school. Charters ensure that our children have a great understanding of the UNCRC articles and how they are relevant to them.
